

### From the Principal



Dear Parents, Guardians, Alum, and Supporters of St. Mary Interparochial School,

The 2020-2021 school year was incredibly unique. Masking, social distancing, and cohorting regulations, combined with simultaneous in-person and virtual instruction, presented many changes and challenges. What has and does remain constant is the resiliency, adaptability, creativity, patience, and dedication of our faculty, staff, students, and families at St. Mary Interparochial School. And even though this year has looked and felt much different than prior school years, there is much to acknowledge and celebrate.

St. Mary Interparochial School began our school-wide Mindfulness initiative. Mindfulness is the ability to be fully present and aware of where we are and what we are doing. And, to not be overly reactive or overwhelmed by what is going on around us. Especially during the pandemic, we are fully committed to supporting the physical health, mental health, and emotional regulation of our students. From this initiative, St. Mary fostered an academic partnership with Roots2Rise (for yoga and mental mindfulness) and Greener Partners (for nutritional mindfulness). Additionally,

both our homeroom teachers and school counselor, Ms. Jamie Cross, led students in daily spiritual and religious mindfulness. These initiatives have positively supported our students and their management of age-appropriate struggles such as fear, anxiety, and depression. We are excited to continue with our mindfulness initiatives and daily mindfulness practices in the 2021-2022 school year. We are also excited to focus on health-based mindfulness with our partnership with Thomas Jefferson University. Through these initiatives, we as a school will continue to strengthen our students' understanding and view of health and will continue to support the faith-based and positive development of our students' bodies, minds, and hearts.

This year, we continued to provide weekly "STREAM" (Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) programming which replaced our technology curriculum. This curriculum shift was the result of current research which suggests that in order to prepare students for the twenty-first-century future workforce, students need to be complex problem-solvers, critical-thinkers, creative, empathetic, and collaborative team members. This program has allowed students to begin to develop these skills through hands-on, project-based, design thinking approaches that emphasize STEAM learning with the added Religious approach. This program shift was supported through a generous two-year grant from the Ambassador's Fund for Education (formerly known as the Archdiocesan Educational Fund). This grant has helped support our STREAM mobile maker spaces (STREAM Carts), and the mindfulness STREAM-based nutritional programming provided through the Greener Partners program.

St. Mary Interparochial School has made a significant investment in technology this school year. Through the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER) grant, we purchased brand new SmartBoards for every homeroom. And, we are pleased to report that all of our teachers

received their SmartBoard certification this school year. Through the Health and Safety grant, we purchased replacement Chromebooks for ones damaged and broken due to increased usage during in-person, hybrid, and remote learning. In addition to this, the school invested in iPads, tripods, and document cameras to support the simultaneous in-person and virtual instruction occurring throughout the year. All of these devices will continue to be utilized as we move forward into this coming school year.

St. Mary Interparochial School is pleased to announce that we have been officially re-accredited by the Middle States Association. A very special thanks to St. Mary Interparochial School's former principal, Jeanne Meredith, and to our Honors Math and Spanish teacher, Denise Pimpinella, who acted as our internal coordinators throughout the Middle States process. St. Mary Interparochial School also officially finalized our third strategic plan. A special thanks to our Director of Advancement, Christina Haciski, for organizing and leading this important process that ensures the success and sustainability of our school.

We would like to share a special thanks to the Connelly Foundation and two of our partner programs! This school year, Carpenter's Hall, in partnership with the Philadelphia Education Fund and Tildie's Toy Box, developed a very special program for our 3rd grade students to learn about architecture and engineering through the Carpenters' Hall Toolbox Project. And, beginning in the 2021-2022 school year, we will begin a two-year partnership with The Philadelphia Outward Bound School for an experiential learning program for our middle school students and professional development learning opportunities for all staff members. These opportunities were made possible through the generous support and funding from the Connelly Foundation.

#### We know that this was a difficult year for our 8th grade class, as many of their annual traditions were modified. reimagined, and/or canceled. But, we at St. Mary were so happy to be able to celebrate with some old and some new traditions! This year, our 8th grade received a St. Mary "first" and held a pool party at the Philadelphia Sports Club. We sincerely thank the Philadelphia Sports Club for this special opportunity for our 8th grade students. We are so proud of you, Class of 2021! We wish you the best of luck in high school. Remember to always shine your St. Mary's light!

As we close the chapter on the 2020-2021 school year, we also close the chapter on the end of an era, with the retirement of our beloved Art Coordinator and Teacher, Mrs. Donna Bridy. Mrs. Bridy, we wish you much love and well-deserved rest in your retirement. With that said, we look forward to welcoming one of our former students, Ms. Morgan McCoy, as our new Art Coordinator and Teacher.

Whatever the mode of learning required, in-person, hybrid, or virtual, with your support, we are able to continue to offer a quality Catholic education to families from various parishes and zip codes while remaining a crown jewel in the historic heart of Philadelphia. # Message from Our Board of Limited Jurisdiction



The challenges presented by the Covid-19 pandemic affected all sectors of society, but perhaps no sector was challenged more than the academic sector. Within the

academic sector, one would be hard-pressed to find more pressing challenges than those presented to the K-8 urban school, which thrives on face to face learning and interpersonal communications inherent in a close-knit school community. The 2020-21 school year was one that could have presented insurmountable challenges to St. Mary. Instead, St. Mary responded stronger than ever, based largely on the strength of its school community, technological prowess, and its core values.

Indeed, St. Mary stood at the vanguard of virtual and remote learning when the pandemic first struck society in March 2020 in the second-half of the 2019-2020 school year. Following the lead of Principal Pugliese and the school's emphasis on 21st technology and the importance of the STREAM curriculum, the school seized the challenge presented by virtual learning and quickly transformed this challenge into a strength. While other schools in Philadelphia and the surrounding counties missed valuable time or struggled to implement a virtual curriculum in the remote learning age, St. Mary pushed through advancing its Blue Ribbon academic curriculum and core mission of developing Christ-centered leaders without missing a step.

St. Mary implemented its remote curriculum and experience from the 2019-2020 school year into the new school year of 2020-2021. Using the remote learning experience as a platform, the school expounded and implemented a program that led to a safe and effective hybrid model of remote and inperson learning, using the latest technology in terms of preventing the spread of the pandemic and ensuring the safety and peace of mind of students and faculty alike. Of course, this would not have been possible without the cooperation and collaborative efforts of the entire school community, including the support of the families and parents of our students.

And now, a new school year awaits, and we appear to return to school life as we once knew it: the entire student body present as the crisp Autumn air marks the beginning of a new school year, the classes full with students and faculty eager to learn, to teach, and to lead. It would be easy to sweep the memory of the pandemic under the figurative rug and press on into the future as though the pandemic never happened. But to do so would overlook one of St. Mary's finest hours, when students, faculty, and the community at large first embraced and then flourished under the challenges presented by remote learning and the other restrictions caused by the pandemic.

Please join me and the other Board members for our open meeting on October 12th as we build on our past accomplishments and resilience, and look forward to continued growth in the future. I look forward to seeing you then.

time to have fun with their classmates — to run, to laugh, and to play. It was a beautiful day for the Saint Mary community.







### History of Saint Mary Interparochial School

The rich academic and historic heritage of St. Mary Interparochial School dates to the early days of Philadelphia, as Catholics and Protestants engaged in a spirited debate over educational practices. Founded in 1782 by the Jesuit fathers of Old St. Joseph's Church, St. Mary is known as "The Mother School" of Catholic parochial education and is credited with influencing Catholic educational patterns in this country. Situated near Independence Hall and other pivotal sites in old Philadelphia, it served children for more than a century before closing in 1902 after a devastating fire. St. Mary reopened in 1968, again with a distinction: With students drawn from six different parishes, it was the first interparochial school in the nation. St. Mary Interparochial School is situated in Independence National Park and serves over 250 children from all over the City of Philadelphia and its suburbs.
